Fidel Castro, the fiery apostle of revolution who brought the Cold War to the Western Hemisphere in **1959** and then defied the United States for nearly half a century as Cuba's maximum leader, bedeviling 11 American presidents and briefly pushing the world to the brink of nuclear war, died on Friday. He wielded power like a tyrant, controlling every aspect of the island's existence. He was Cuba's "Máximo Líder." From atop a Cuban Army tank, he directed his country's defense at the [Bay of Pigs](#). Countless details fell to him, from selecting the color of uniforms that Cuban soldiers wore in Angola to overseeing a program to produce a superbreed of milk cows. He personally set the goals for sugar harvests. **He personally sent countless men to prison.**

"Fidel was a boisterous young student who was sent away to study with the Jesuits at the Colegio de Dolores in Santiago de Cuba and later to the Colegio de Belén, an exclusive Jesuit high school in Havana."

More than 500 Batista-era officials were brought before courts-martial and special tribunals, **summarily convicted and shot to death.** The grainy black-and-white images of the executions broadcast on American television horrified viewers.

Mr. Castro defended the executions as necessary to solidify the revolution. He complained that the United States had raised not a whimper when Mr. Batista had tortured and executed thousands of opponents.

But to wary observers in the United States, the executions were a signal that Mr. Castro was not the democratic savior he had seemed. **In May 1959, he began [confiscating privately owned agricultural land, including land owned by Americans](#), openly provoking the United States government.**

As the first waves of [Cuban exiles](#) arrived in Miami and northern New Jersey after the revolution, many were intent on overthrowing the man they had once supported. Their number would eventually total a million, many from what had been, proportionately, the largest middle class in Latin America.

Crowds flood streets of Miami's Little Havana to cheer Castro's death

"Miami (CNN) - [News of Fidel Castro's death](#) was quick to reach Miami, the center of the Cuban exile community, where an outpouring of emotion brought jubilant crowds onto the streets of Little Havana."

"It was a party decades in the making, and you could hear it before you could see it."

"Brandishing pots and pans, hundreds of elated Cubans paraded through the Miami neighborhood of Little Havana on Saturday night. They waved the Cuban flag as they cheered the death of a man who defined the lives of so many through decades in exile in the United States."

"The party was still going strong Saturday evening, more than 12 hours after the news of Castro's death was first announced on Cuban TV."

"All Saturday there were waves of celebrations in Little Havana as people cheered and sang along with festive music."

" "This is a celebration, but in a way, not a celebration of a death -- but it's a celebration, hopefully, of a beginning of liberty that we are all waiting for, for many years," one reveler born in Cuba told CNN."

" "The hope is that not just because Fidel died, but also hopefully it opens up the people in Cuba a little bit more to go against what's happening there." "

"Many families have suffered decades of separation, he said, with those who left unable to return."

"Denise Castro (no relation) says her family isn't celebrating Fidel Castro's death per se -- they're celebrating the idea that "a piece of that old Communism is dead with him." "

"But she acknowledged that it was too late for many of the victims of Castro's regime."

"Leeza Fortunato was born in Cuba and came to Miami during the Mariel boatlift in 1980 with her mom and dad, a political prisoner who spent 10 years in one of Castro's jails. "My dad died earlier this year," Fortunato says. "If he was still alive, he would be here celebrating. I'm here to honor him." [#LittleHavana](#)"

"Another Cuban-American, born in Miami, told CNN he saw this as a "great moment, not to celebrate the death of somebody but to celebrate freedom," particularly for the many political prisoners still held in Cuba."

" "I would love to go to Cuba, a free Cuba. Right now Cuba is not free. And so the hope is -- and I think the celebrations here show -- everybody here hopes for a free Cuba soon and for human rights on the island to come to pass." "

"Some Cuban exiles have waited years to mark this moment, with many false alarms along the way."

"Miami-Dade County's mayor, Carlos A. Gimenez, said Castro's death "closes a very painful chapter" for Cubans and Cuban-Americans "affected by his cruel and brutal dictatorship." "

"He said he hoped a "free and democratic Cuba" would emerge but cautioned that Fidel's younger brother, President Raul Castro, remained in charge of "one of the world's most repressive governments." "

"Painful decades of exile"

"Those out on the streets included Cuban-Americans of all ages, including some who first came from Cuba in 1959 after Castro's revolutionaries ousted dictator Fulgencio Batista."

"Others left in the following decades, many joining their fellow exiles in Miami and elsewhere in the United States."

"More than 260,000 Cubans left in a US-organized airlift between 1965 and 1973. In 1980, Castro let another 125,000 leave in the chaotic Mariel boatlift. Among them were criminals released from Cuban jails who brought a violent crime wave to Florida. **At other times, desperate Cubans fled the island nation in makeshift boats across the treacherous Straits of Florida. Thousands died from drowning or exposure to the brutal Caribbean sun.**"

"Few who left back in 1959 would have believed Fidel Castro would hang on to power for so long, only ceding the presidency to his brother Raul in recent years."

"Speaking alongside other lawmakers from Florida, Rep. Mario Diaz-Balart, who is Cuban-American, said, "Today is a reminder of how inevitable it is that the Castro dictatorship will soon enough be a nightmare of the past." "

"The term "**Cuban exile**" refers to the many [Cubans](#) who fled from or left the island of [Cuba](#). These peoples consist of two primary groups loosely defined by the period of time occurring before and after the Mariel boat lift of the 1980s. The pre-Mariel group consisted of the mostly middle and upper classes of the island who fled due to fear of widespread reprisals after the communist takeover led by Fidel Castro in the late 1950s-1970s. The people in this group were mainly seeking [political asylum](#). The second group consists of those peoples who emigrated from Cuba during and after the period of the Mariel boat lift of the 1980s. By and large, the majority of these peoples were, and are, [economic migrants](#). The phenomenon date back to the [Ten Years' War](#) and the struggle for Cuban independence during the 19th century. In modern times, the term refers to the large exodus of Cubans to the [United States](#) since the 1959 [Cuban Revolution](#)."

Castro studied in Jesuit schools in Oriente and in Havana, where one of his high school teachers, Father Armando Llorente, recalled him as "motivated, proud, different from the others".

Moreover, it seems that the Jesuit's efforts in nurturing the monster were not by mistake, but by design. Argentinean journalist Alfredo Muñoz Unsaín, for many years Havana's correspondent for France Press, tells a quite revealing story. Father Padre Arrupe visited Cuba in the early 1980s, and Muñoz Unsaín had the opportunity of talking to him on several occasions. In one of them, recalls the reporter, the Black Pope gave him the classic Jesuit spiel, ending by telling that he was very pleased with the work of the Jesuits in Latin America, particularly of the many important disciples they have developed who later reached prominent positions in all walks of life. "Well, I guess you are not proud of all of them," retorted Unsaín, and added, "Don't forget that Fidel Castro was one of your disciples." To what Arrupe answered, in the classic Jesuit way, by using a question to answer another one, "And what makes you think we are not proud of Fidel Castro?" <http://www.amigospais-guaracabuya.org/oagsg005.php>

Castro, instead of being sent to an inadequate state school, went to Jesuit colleges in Santiago de Cuba and the capital Havana. Santiago is the capital of Oriente Province, from which the rebellion against Spain was launched. Havana was even then a centre of political and social corruption. The contrast and the lesson must have their impact on the growing boy.

Aug. 13, 1926 – Fidel Castro is born into a moderately affluent family of sugar cane plantation owners and baptized as a **Roman Catholic**. His father, Angel Castro, was a self-made immigrant from Spain who had married his maid, Lina Ruz, with whom he had seven children.

Fidel Castro attends Catholic elementary school and graduates from Belen, a Mass-every-morning prep school in Havana run by **Jesuit [CCL: Roman Catholic] priests**.

Castro would say later that the faith offered at Belen was “very dogmatic” and describe himself as having been a restless student. Nonetheless, he said **Jesuits “influenced me with their strict organization, their discipline and their values. ... They influenced my sense of justice.”**

1959 – Castro takes power by leading a Marxist revolution. He bans religious celebrations, closes down more than 400 Catholic schools, including Belen, seizes church properties, and jails and expels Catholic priests.

1962 – The Vatican, which had excommunicated all Catholics involved with communist groups in its 1949 Decree Against Communism, adds Fidel Castro to the list of those ejected from the church.

1976 – A decade and a half after the revolution, Cuba adopts a constitution which declares the country to be an atheist state.

1991 – Castro has the constitution amended to redefine Cuba as a secular state. The Communist Party allows religious believers to become members.

1985 – Castro meets a delegation of **visiting U.S. bishops** and praises Christian values such as sacrifice, austerity and humility. “I told them that if they organized a state in accord with Christian precepts, they’d create one similar to ours,” he would later tell the Brazilian Dominican friar Frei Betto.

1996 – **Fidel Castro visits the Vatican**. During a 35-minute meeting, the Cuban leader tells St. John Paul II: ” Your Holiness [**CCL: sic**], I expect to see you soon in Cuba.”

1998 – St. [**CCL: sic**] John Paul II visits Havana and meets Castro, who wore a dark suit instead of his standard military uniform. The Pope talked about human rights and blasted the lack of basic freedoms in Cuba. Christmas is reinstated as a national holiday.

2012 – Pope Benedict XVI visits Havana and meets Fidel, who had relinquished power to his brother Raul, after celebrating Mass on Revolution Square. Benedict requests that Good Friday also be recognized as an official holiday.

2015 – Castro meets with Pope Francis, who is visiting Cuba on his way to the United States. The retired Cuban leader gives the pontiff a copy of “Fidel and Religion” a 353-page book based on 23 hours of interviews between him and Betto.
