BRUCE GORDON

Gordon (PhD, University of St. Andrews) is the Titus Street Professor of Ecclesiastical History at Yale Divinity School. He is the author of the following works: *John Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion* (Princeton, 2016), *Calvin* (Yale, 2009), and *Swiss Reformation* (Manchester, 2002)



RYAN REEVES

Reeves (PhD, Cambridge University) is Assistant Professor of Historical Theology at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, where he also serves as Dean of the Jacksonville campus. He writes regularly for The Gospel Coalition. He is the author of *English Evangelicals and Tudor Obedience, C.1527-1570. Studies in the History of Christian Traditions* (Brill, 2013). He is currently working on a biography of William Tyndale



SAM ALLBERRY

Allberry is a pastor based in Maidenhead, UK. He studied theology at Wycliffe Hall in Oxford, England. He also serves as part of the speaking team for Ravi Zacharias International Ministries, is an editor for The Gospel Coalition, and has authored the following books: *Is God Anti-Gay?* (The Good Book Company, 2013), *Why Bother With Church?* (The Good Book Company, 2016), and *James For You* (The Good Book Company, 2016)



W. ROBERT GODFREY

Godfrey (PhD, Stanford University) is President and Professor of Church History at Westminster Seminary California. He is the author of *John Calvin: Pilgrim and Pastor* (Crossway, 2009), *Learning to Love the Psalms* (Reformation Trust, 2017), *Reformation Sketches: Insights into Luther, Calvin, and the Confessions* (P&R, 2008)



VINCENT BACOTE

Bacote (PhD, Drew University) is Associate Professor of Theology and Director of the Center for Applied Christian Ethics at Wheaton College. He is the author of *The Political Disciple: A Theology of Public Life* (Zondervan, 2015) and *The Spirit in Public Theology: Appropriating the Legacy of Abraham Kuyper* (Wipf & Stock, 2010)



MARK ROSS

Ross (PhD, University of Keele) is the First Presbyterian Church - John R. de Witt Professor of Systematic Theology and Director of the Institute for Reformed Worship at Erskine Theological Seminary, Columbia, SC. With over 30 years of pastoral and teaching experience, Ross is a much sought after speaker and lecturer. He has written *Let's Study Matthew* (Banner of Truth, 2009)



WILLIAM EDGAR

Edgar (Honors Music B.A., Harvard University; MDiv, Westminster Theological Seminary; DThéol, Université de Genève; D.D. Faculté Jean Calvin) is Professor of Apologetics at Westminster Theological Seminary, Philadelphia, where he has taught since 1989. Edgar is currently Professeur Associé at the Faculté Jean Calvin, Aix-en-Provence, France. He directs the jazz band Renewal. His most recently published books include *Schaeffer on the Christian Life* (Crossway, 2013) *Does Christianity Really Work?* (Christian Focus, 2016) and *Created and Creating: A Biblical Theology of Culture* (Crossway, 2017). He and his wife, Barbara, have two (married) children and three grandchildren



JONNY GIBSON

Gibson (PhD, Cambridge University) is assistant professor of Old Testament at Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia. He previously served as associate minister at Cambridge Presbyterian Church in Cambridge, England for over two years. Along with his brother, David, he is the contributing co-editor of *From Heaven He Came and Sought Her* (Crossway, 2013). Jonny is a life-long Manchester United fan



MICHAEL A.G. HAYKIN

Haykin (ThD, Wycliffe College, Toronto) is Professor of Church History and Biblical Spirituality and the Director of The Andrew Fuller Center for Baptist Studies at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, KY. He is the author of *Rediscovering the Church Fathers: Who They Were and How They Shaped the Church* (Crossway, 2011), *Eight Women of Faith* (Crossway, 2016), and *Patrick of Ireland: His Life and Impact* (Christian Focus, 2014)



BRIAN HABIG

Habig is pastor of Downtown Presbyterian Church, Greenville SC. He graduated from Mississippi State University and Covenant Theological Seminary. After seminary, he served as a campus minister with Reformed University Fellowship at MSU and at Vanderbilt University



TIMOTHY GEORGE

George (PhD, Harvard University) has been the dean of Beeson Divinity School since its inception in 1988. He also serves as Professor of Divinity, History and Doctrine. He is the author of *Reading Scripture with the Reformers* (IVP, 2011). His *Theology of the Reformers* (Broadman & Holman, 2013) celebrated its 25th anniversary edition in 2013 and is the standard textbook of Reformation theology for many schools and seminaries
